JOB GOAL: Responsible for creating a classroom environment to develop competencies, knowledge, and skills in foreign languages and cultures through technology in accordance with each student's ability; to interpret to students, the culture of the countries where the language is spoken.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Teaches skills and knowledge in foreign language instruction utilizing curriculum designated by the Roseland School District and other appropriate learning activities.
2. Develops lesson plans and supplementary materials compatible with the basic division's basic instructional philosophy and congruent with NJSLs for World Languages and Technology.
3. Develops pupil understanding and appreciation of culture of countries where the studied language is spoken.
4. Evaluates each student's progress in meeting the course standards in comprehension, speaking, reading, and/or writing world languages.
5. Evaluates academic and social growth of students.
6. Establishes and maintains standards of student behavior needed to provide an orderly, productive classroom environment.
7. Identified student needs and cooperates with other professional staff members in assessing and helping students solve learning, health, and attitude problems.

8. Communicates with parents and school counselors on student progress.
9. Supervises students in assigned out-of-classroom activities during the assigned working day.
10. Participates in faculty committees and the sponsorship of student activities.
11. Models nondiscriminatory practices in all activities.
12. Performs other duties within the scope of his/her employment and certification as may be assigned.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT: This is a ten month position with compensation being determined in accordance with the appropriate negotiated agreement.

EVALUATION: Performance of this job will be evaluated annually in accordance with state law and the provisions of the board's policy on evaluation.
