
2023-24 Spring NJSLA by Subgroup Race










Notable Achievements

In ELA we had 75.1% of all students at the achievement levels of Meeting or Exceeding Expectation compared to last year 71.9%. (+3.2%) State average this year 50%

In Math we had 73.5% of all students at the achievement levels of Meeting or Exceeding Expectations compared to the last year 69.2%. (+4.3%) State average this year 42.2%

In Science we had an increase of +6.5% of 5th grade students at the achievement levels of Proficient or Advanced Proficient compared to last year.

Third grade percentage increased the number of students in the Meeting & Exceeding Proficiency Levels. (ELA – 22.7% & Math 10.3%)

- Introduce opportunities for teacher Professional Development in Math to improve their content knowledge and instructional practices.
- Continued teacher Professional Development to focus on Phonics Instruction K-3.
- The High Impact Tutoring grant provided opportunities for academic support beyond the school day.
- Continued use of LinkIt data to drive instruction and individual student achievement including Early Literacy Support, K-2 Phonics, In-Class Math Support, collaborative teaching, individualized placement, and small group instruction.

- Financial- The Roseland Board of Education will develop and implement the annual budget to continue supporting educational and operational initiatives while providing fiscal accountability to the community and remaining cognizant of anticipated long-term financial needs.
- Board Training The Roseland Board of Education will develop a support plan for new board members which encompasses skills in teamwork, consensus building, collaborative problem solving, and ethical decision making.
- Board-Borough Partnership The Roseland Board of Education will maintain ongoing and meaningful dialogue with the Borough government to best support the children of Roseland.

- Student Achievement -To promote a collaborative teaching, learning, and assessment environment that inspires creativity, innovation, and differentiation to support all learners.
- Character Development To ensure that all students will receive social and emotional support to become adaptable, confident citizens who embody self-awareness and strong interpersonal skills, and who are capable of responsible decision-making and managing their emotions and behaviors.
- Culture & Climate To promote and support a healthy and balanced environment for teaching and learning.
